

Brenda Swenson: What is the Purpose of Art?

Life is busy. When I get time for myself I need something that will recharge my creative battery and feed my weary soul... sketching.

Sketching is a very broad term and I'm often asked, "What exactly is a sketch?" A sketch is anything I do in my sketchbook. Some people will disagree...that's okay. Let's face it the world is full of rules, laws, guidelines, restrictions, constraints... What I do in my sketchbooks is not defined or dictated by anyone but me (big smile). What happens in my sketchbook is my playground, my challenges, my success, my failures... my business.

My sketchbook is a safe place to go when I want or need to recharge, create, stretch, grow, play, explore and sometimes pour out my heart. Within the pages I don't ask for anyone's approval or acceptance. Everyone needs a safe place to call our own. A place where we don't seek or need anyone's approval or acceptance.

You will learn more about me by looking through one of my sketchbooks than seeing an entire show of my work. Why is that? My paintings are me at my best (dressed up, made-up and on my best behavior). My sketchbooks are a true picture of me (in my play clothes, being silly, exploring my world, hurting...as a friend would see me).

I take my sketchbooks everywhere I go. You can find me sketching at a cafe, in a garden, airport, sketching with friends...or a hospital. People passing by like to comment. Most of the time they say, "nice sketch", "wish I was talented" or "are you an artist?" But I've also heard, "What a shame it's in a sketchbook, you could have sold it". Why is it that so many people do not see the value of something unless they can attach a dollar amount to it?

I'd like to leave you with this questions. What is the purpose of art if it does not feed the soul of the one who creates it?

Go to the website and scroll down to the VWS logo on the left of your screen. Follow the prompts to register and download your images. Be sure to read the prospectus for important guidelines. Entries close 2/18/18 at midnight.

Any member who enters work may submit up to 10 pieces of bin art (unframed, matted and protected) whether or not their work has been juried into the exhibit. Fees: \$45 for up to three pieces.

What is the society show? It is an opportunity for each member to bring their paintings to the General Meeting. Everyone is always interested to see what our members are painting. The Demonstrator that evening is asked to pick 4 winners. The First Place winner receives \$20.00. Any VWS member may participate. We ask you only bring one painting per meeting since space is limited. Come to our next meeting with a painting and you could be picked as a Society Show Winner!

Workshop Policy

- 1) The full amount for each workshop is required when you sign up. Your space will not be guaranteed without payment by check or cash.
- 2) The workshop fee includes a 25% nonrefundable cancellation fee (except as noted in #4 below) if a cancellation is made less than 7 days prior to the workshop, unless the spot is filled. Any refund given will be minus the 25% cancellation fee.
- 3) No refund will be made for a NO SHOW or a cancellation with less than 2 days of prior notice, unless the spot is filled.
- 4) For workshops that are 3 days or longer, we require a deposit of 50% with sign up. These workshops are with artists from out-of-town and special financial arrangements have to be made for their visits. The full amount is due 60 days prior to the workshop. A cancellation fee of 50% (instead) of 25%) applies.
- 5) A workshop may be cancelled at the discretion of the Workshop Chair and the President if any of the following occur: There are less than 10 participants, the workshop is not at a financial break-even point, or the demonstrator or location cancels. In this case, full refunds will be given.
- 6) Payment by check for individual workshops must have a current date and should not be post-dated. Checks for multiple workshops and cash will be promptly deposited.

Our General Meeting and Workshop Location

Traveling South on Reseda, Oxnard is the next intersection just after the Metro Orange Bus line terminal. If traveling North on Reseda, Oxnard is the intersection just before the Metro Orange Bus line terminal. There is parking on the street and also in the back of the building complex. To access the back parking lot you can drive through the arches and through the gate, or turn at the corner and use the alley to enter the gate of the parking lot.
