














Tim Katz Demonstrator on Thursday May 13th, 7:00pm

Timothy Kitz is an accomplished award winning watercolorist whose "plein aire" and studio works reflect an ongoing creative journey that produces landscape and urban scene paintings of a distinctive style, freshness and fluidity. His appreciation for, and highly personal interpretation of our local environment can be traced to influences by the California Scene movement and the early coastal impressionists. A largely self-taught watercolorist, the evolution of his craft has been informed by a lifetime of passion for the medium through an extensive book collection, exhibition pilgrimages and through workshops.

As a painting instructor, he conducts popular weekly watercolor workshops at the Santa Monica Camera Obscura Art Lab and Sinai Temple in Westwood California. He is regularly sought after as a juror, demonstrator and to conduct workshops for regional arts organizations.

His formal fine arts education was at the University of Toledo School of Design and Herron School of Art of Indiana University. He continues to hone his plein aire experience and exhibition presence through active participation and exhibitions with the Allied Artists of the Santa Monica Mountains and Seashore, the Valley Watercolor Society, the National Watercolor Society, the California Art Club and representation at Saga Fine Art Gallery in Monrovia California and Hale Arts in Santa Monica. ©

Workshop Policy

- 1) The full amount for each workshop is required when you sign up. Your space will not be guaranteed without payment by check or cash.
- 2) The workshop fee includes a 25% nonrefundable cancellation fee (except as noted in #4 below) if a cancellation is made less than 7 days prior to the workshop, unless the spot is filled. Any refund given will be minus the 25% cancellation fee.
- 3) No refund will be made for a NO SHOW or a cancellation with less than 2 days of prior notice, unless the spot is filled.
- 4) For workshops that are 3 days or longer, we require a deposit of 50% with sign up. These workshops are with artists from out-of-town and special financial arrangements have to be made for their visits. The full amount is due 60 days prior to the workshop. A cancellation fee of 50% (instead) of 25%) applies.
- 5) A workshop may be cancelled at the discretion of the Workshop Chair and the President if any of the following occur: There are less than 10 participants, the workshop is not at a financial break-even point, or the demonstrator or location cancels. In this case, full refunds will be given.
- 6) Payment by check for individual workshops must have a current date and should not be post-dated. Checks for multiple workshops and cash will be promptly deposited.
