Art Supply Basics Every Artist Should Have

If you search the internet you will no doubt find hundreds of sites with lists of art supplies that every artist should have in their respective "tool boxes". If you ask an artist how much art stuff is enough you are likely to hear "...just a little more!"

With that in mind and in the spirit of great art, we will now offer you our thoughts on the basics every artist should own and even finish with a few that we all wish we could add to our studio.

- 1. The most basic tool you should own, regardless of your chosen medium, is a good <u>pencil</u> or pencil set. For general sketching a 2B will be sufficient. Pencils are graded from hard (9H) to soft (8B) with the 2B somewhere in the middle. This means you can use it for general sketching and shading but might want to have a 6B for more intense shading and a 7H for really light areas.
- 2. Like it our not, not everything we draw will make the grade and that's where our second basic art supply comes in handy: the eraser. The two that should be in every artist tool kit would be the <u>vinyl</u> and the <u>kneaded</u> eraser. Kneaded erasers can be molded and used to erase or to lighten lines or areas of shading without completely erasing them. The vinyl or plastic eraser is soft and can be used to eliminate lines without tearing your paper. Graphite residue does not build up on them and they typically last a long time.
 - 3. Now we need something to draw on. Read whole article

The Demonstrator that evening is asked to pick 4 winners. The First Place winner receives \$20.00. Any VWS member may participate. We ask you only bring one painting per meeting since space is limited. Come to our next meeting with a painting and you could be picked as a Society Show Winner!

Workshop Policy

- 1) The full amount for each workshop is required when you sign up. Your space will not be guaranteed without payment by check or cash.
- 2) The workshop fee includes a 25% nonrefundable cancellation fee (except as noted in #4 below) if a cancellation is made less than 7 days prior to the workshop, unless the spot is filled. Any refund given will be minus the 25% cancellation fee.
- 3) No refund will be made for a NO SHOW or a cancellation with less than 2 days of prior notice, unless the spot is filled.
- 4) For workshops that are 3 days or longer, we require a deposit of 50% with sign up. These workshops are with artists from out-of-town and special financial arrangements have to be made for their visits. The full amount is due 60 days prior to the workshop. A cancellation fee of 50% (instead) of 25%) applies.
- 5) A workshop may be cancelled at the discretion of the Workshop Chair and the President if any of the following occur: There are less than 10 participants, the workshop is not at a financial break-even point, or the demonstrator or location cancels. In this case, full refunds will be given.
- 6) Payment by check for individual workshops must have a current date and should not be post-dated. Checks for multiple workshops and cash will be promptly deposited.
