Deborah Swan - McDonald Demonstrator, Thursday May 12th

Deborah Swan-McDonald is a well known member of Valley Watercolor Society. She has exhibited numerous times in our Annual Juried exhibit and given previous demonstrations and workshops. Last month her painting "Teenage Noir" won a Special Honor award in VWS annual juried exhibition.

She has studied and taken workshops with a number of well known master-painters. Some of these teachers are Katherine Liu, Jake Lee, Hal Reed, Zoltan Szabo, Charles Reid, Barbara Nechis and Irving Shapiro. These amazing instructors have helped her to become skilled and find her own path in art. She enjoys portraying the essence of people. Fluid watercolor washes are used to capture the impression of her subjects'. She tries to capture their poses and expressions, alluding to their inner-

most feelings, hoping to connect the viewer with them via universal themes.

Gardens and landscapes are also favorite themes. Her first pictorial memories are of the farmlands, streams and forests of the Midwest where she lived as a child. Impressions of those days often appear in her paintings as anything from a rich palette of autumn colors to the cooler colors of a forest stream dappled by light. She has lived in California most of her adult life where there are a limitless variety of landscapes and gardens for inspirations.

Deborah is an instructor of watercolor at Otis College of Art and Design extension classes and also private classes. She is a Juried member if Watercolor West and a signature member of national Watercolor Society.

The Scholarship Winners were each awarded \$500.00.







Directions

From the West on the Pasadena Freeway (110): Exit at Orange Grove Blvd., go North (turn left) and proceed six traffic lights to Green Street. Turn right onto Green Street, go one block and turn right onto St. John Ave (one way street going south). Go half a block and park in the underground parking structure on the right.

From the East on the Foothill Freeway (210): Exit at Orange Grove Blvd. via the Ventura Freeway (134). Go South (turn left) on Orange Grove, then turn left at the second traffic light onto Green Street and turn right onto St. John Ave (one way street going south). Go south half a block and park in the underground parking structure on the right.

From the Ventura Freeway (134): Exit at Orange Grove Blvd. and proceed straight onto Colorado Blvd. Turn right at the first traffic light onto St. John Ave. Go south one and one-half blocks and park in the underground parking structure on the right.

From the north on the Foothill Freeway (210): Take the Colorado Blvd. exit, proceed straight onto Saint John Ave., and park in the underground parking structure on the right.

Phyllis Doyon, Friday November 11 - I have always loved to work with watercolor and water media, enjoying the vibrant colors and flow of the paint. Committing to bold color early in the painting keeps the work clean and transparent. This is what gives watercolor its sparkle and life. (members \$50. / non members \$70.)

Workshop Policy

- The full amount for each workshop is required when you sign up. Your space will not be guaranteed without payment by check or cash.
- 2.) The workshop fee includes a 25% non-refundable cancellation fee (except as noted in #4 below) if a cancellation is made less than 7 days prior to the workshop, unless the spot is filled. Any refund given will be minus the 25% cancellation fee.
- 3.) No refund will be made for a NO SHOW or a cancellation with less than 2 days of prior notice, unless the spot is filled.
- 4.) For workshops that are 3 days or longer, we require a deposit of 50% with sign up. These workshops are with artists from out-of town and special financial arrangements have to be made for their visits. The full amount is due 60 days prior to the workshop. A cancellation fee of 50% (instead) of 25%) applies.
- 5.) A workshop may be cancelled at the discretion of the Workshop Chair and the President if any of the following occur: There are less than 10 participants, the workshop is not at a financial breakeven point, or the demonstrator or location cancels. In this case, full refunds will be given.
- 6.) Payment by check for individual workshops must have a current date and should not be post-dated. Checks for multiple workshops and cash will be promptly deposited.
